

We also want to announce the Abolition 2000 Annual General Meeting.



Be part of the Global Days of Action Against Military Spending

This year, GCOMS will include GDAMS in April-May and Cut-Milex in October-November. The IPB Global Day(s) of Action on Military Spending (GDAMS) will include the period from April 14 to May 3rd, 2018. This way, GDAMS includes the U.S. Tax Day, when Americans pay their taxes and debate their use, together with the previous week-end, when most of the U.S. actions will take place. GDAMS 2018 will also include May 2nd, the date of the release of the annual world military expenditure figures by the Stockholm International Peace Research Institute (SIPRI). Moreover, May 3rd is the Constitution Day in Japan. This way, GDAMS could help taking actions on Japan prime Minister Abe's attempts to amend warrenouncing Article 9 of the Japan Constitution (this being the main hook in Peace Boat 2018 GCOMS efforts). And May 3rd will also be the last day of the 2018 Preparatory Committee for the 2020 Nuclear Non-Proliferation Treaty **Review Conference.**

We need to involve even more citizens and organizations in an open and robust debate on the counter-productive results of military expenditure. More than ever, we need new partners to work on the ongoing Global Campaign on Military Spending (GCOMS), and to make the Global Days of Action on Military Spending (GDAMS) a great success!

Between April 14 and May 3rd, 2018, GDAMS will include as many actions as possible worldwide to ask for a redirection of military spending. GDAMS 2018 slogan will be:

Reducing 10% of military assets will help saving our planet. Take action!

IPB and Partners to host International Conference on Nuclear Dangers and the Ban Treaty Hopes

The UN will be holding the first High Level Conference on Nuclear Disarmament in May, while an international conference in New York will assess the dangers of Great Power and nuclear war, and the possibilities opened by the Nuclear Weapons Ban Treaty and other peace and disarmament initiatives.

With a warning that the danger of nuclear war is more "dire" than at any time during the Cold War, the Bulletin of the Atomic Scientists has moved the hands of the Doomsday Clock to two minutes to midnight. This is the closest the hands have been to nuclear annihilation in the clock's 71-year history. The Bulletin focused on the Trump Administration's Nuclear Posture Review, with its increased reliance on nuclear weapons, the staggering investments driving the U.S. nuclear "modernization" and that of the world's other nuclear powers. They decried the return to Cold War rhetoric and absence of U.S.-Russian arms control negotiations, with both the INF and the New START treaties at risk. They expressed alarm about Trump's threats to attack North Korea and about the DPRK's nuclear weapons program, the lack of coherent US foreign and military policies, Trump's threat to the nuclear deal with Iran, South Asian rivalries and climate change.

All nuclear weapon states are modernizing their nuclear arsenals. The costs of the modernization of the US nuclear weapons will be more than 1 Trillion Dollar during the next 20 years. The urgent necessity of eliminating nuclear weapons and the existential danger they pose could not be clearer. At the same time, after years of campaigning, ICAN was awarded the 2017 Nobel Peace Prize. With other nuclear disarmament organizations, international organizations like the Red Cross/Red Crescent movement, and the majority of governments especially from the Global South, ICAN was recognized for its role in the negotiation of the Treaty on the Prohibition of Nuclear Weapons (TPNW,) adopted by 122 countries. It has since been signed by 56 nations and ratified by 5. Despite heavy pressure from the nine Nuclear Weapons states, including blackmailing their friends and allies, this powerful treaty provides a path leading toward the total elimination of nuclear weapons.

On the eve of the UN High Level Conference on Nuclear Disarmament, the International Peace Bureau, and partner organizations organize an International Conference to raise the alarm, to analyze and warn about nuclear dangers, to raise up the Ban Treaty and other nuclear disarmament initiatives, and to build the US and world movement for peace and complete nuclear disarmament.

AGM Session 1: Geneva. April 28

States Parties to the NPT will be meeting in Geneva from April 23 – May 4 for the <u>2nd</u> <u>Preparatory Conference for the 2020 NPT Review</u>. The Abolition 2000 AGM will be held in the weekend in-between the two weeks of NPT deliberations.

Abolition 2000 was established at the *1995 NPT Review and Extension Conference*, with a focus on the full implementation of Article VI of the NPT, the obligation to achieve complete nuclear disarmament. We have been active at all the NPT review conferences and preparatory meetings since then.

The UN General Assembly is holding its first ever <u>High-Level Conference on Nuclear Disarmament</u> from May 14-16 in New York. Abolition 2000 members have been encouraging governments to attend at the highest level, and to advance concrete nuclear-risk reduction and disarmament measures at the conference.

Abolition 2000 members are also organizing some parallel events including <u>Count the Nuclear</u> <u>Weapons Money</u> from May 10-16 and an international conference on nuclear disarmament on May 12.
