Peace by peaceful means. Ceasefire and negotiations now!

We, the organizers of the International Summit for Peace in Ukraine, call on leaders in all countries to act in support of an immediate ceasefire and negotiations to end the war in Ukraine.

We are a broad and politically diverse coalition that represents peace movements and civil society, including people of faith in many countries. We are firmly united in our belief that war is a crime against humanity and there is no military solution to the current crisis.

Far greater death and suffering may yet ensue if the conflict escalates to the use of nuclear weapons, a risk that is higher today than at any point since the Cuban missile crisis.

We condemn Russia's illegal invasion of Ukraine. The institutions established to ensure peace and security in Europe fell short, and the failure of diplomacy led to war. Now diplomacy is urgently needed to end the war before it destroys Ukraine and endangers humanity.

> The path to peace must be based on the principles of common security, respect for international human rights and self determination of all communities.

We support all negotiations that stand for the logic of peace instead of the illogic of war.

We call on civil society in all countries to join us in a week of global mobilization (Saturday 30th September - Sunday 8th October 2023) for an immediate ceasefire and peace negotiations to end this war.



IPB's Peace Work: Israel - Palestine







The International Peace Bureau (IPB), Middle East Treaty Organization (METO), and International Physicians for the Prevention of Nuclear War (IPPNW) are deeply concerned over the unprecedented Israeli-Palestinian violent escalation launched in the morning of Saturday, 7th October, which has already resulted in the loss of hundreds of lives. The resulting fear, panic, and uncertainty that the Israeli and Palestinian people feel in these moments demand our compassion and understanding, even as the extent to which the conflict will escalate remains unclear.

The death toll cannot continue to rise. The signatories to this statement therefore call for immediate global attention to deescalate the conflict and provide on-theground humanitarian assistance. Furthermore, we call on the international community to support the immediate cessation of attacks and abductions of civilians and attacks on non-military infrastructure. The UNSC must live up to its chartermandated responsibility for the maintenance of international peace and security. It should urgently demand all parties to stop violence and respect and protect lives of civilians, especially children.

There is no military solution to the multifaceted and complex crisis between Israel and Palestine; we acknowledge the deep suffering of Palestinians and Israelis even under the status quo, including settler violence, terrorist attacks, economic violence, and a constant environment of fear under violation of international law. The root causes of the conflict are deep and can only be addressed when immediate and direct violence is not present.

International Tribunal for Peace in Manipur

- Aims to raise awareness of ongoing human rights abuses in Manipur and past atrocities spanning 70 years;
- Concerned members emphasize the involvement of third-party non-partisan groups in conflict-resolution processes trusted by all sides;
- Possible locations for the tribunal include The Hague, Geneva, New York, and a visit to India/Manipur;
- Involve Indigenous leaders from Manipur and worldwide with conflict experience was highlighted;
- Commits to ongoing documentation of the armed conflict, resource sharing, outreach, and maintaining communication throughout the tribunal's process.






