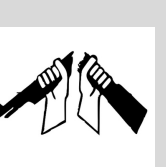
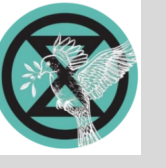


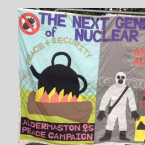
People from across the world are coming to Lakenheath.

Why?

Because they want peace and a nuclear-free world. They understand that this base in Suffolk is a central hub of deadly NATO military and nuclear activity. Activity which is making the world far more dangerous and making us all targets.

With 59% of the British public saying no to US nuclear bombs in Britain, we're helping show that US nukes aren't welcome in Britain or anywhere.





Why is Lakenheath so dangerous?

- The US plans to site new nuclear bombs at the base. In fact they may already be here. But the government refuses to say anything, because they don't want local people to know about the dangers.
- These bombs have three times the destructive power of the US atomic bomb which killed over 200,000 people in Hiroshima in 1945.
- F35A jets already stationed at the base can launch the bombs.
- These fighter jets have been involved in Israel's genocidal war against the Palestinian people in Gaza.
- For decades, jets from the base have been used to kill and maim civilians in Iraq, Libya, Afghanistan and Syria.
- Local residents are put on the frontline - a target for attack. They also suffer from noise pollution when the jets carry out military exercises. Emissions are polluting the environment - and the F35A jets are the most fuel-intensive ever made.

Nuclear weapons and war don't bring peace

- We need real, sustainable security. That means having enough to eat, a safe place to live and access to decent healthcare. The billions this government spends on nuclear weapons and war should instead be spent on rebuilding our crumbling schools and hospitals.
- There is an alternative to poverty, nuclear war and climate chaos. Over 70% want Britain to sign up to The Treaty on the Prohibition of Nuclear Weapons which is banning nuclear weapons everywhere.
- Help build a peaceful, sustainable, nuclear-free world.
