

We invite you to a conference in Vilnius/Lithuania on April 24-27, 2025 as a participant in the International Observer Group for Peace and Climate Justice. Here and in the surrounding countries, immense human suffering took place during World War II. Now history is repeating itself for refugees from Ukraine, Belarus and Russia who are affected by war and oppression today. It is also repeating itself now as climate change increasingly like a vicious war brings extreme weather events and the subsequent loss and damage and then migration, hardship, and victimization of the most vulnerable and weakest. Together we want to call for peace on earth and peace with the earth.

We demand an end to wars and the threat of nuclear weapons! We demand cooperation across all borders to address the causes and consequences of global warming of the climate with extreme weather effects in its wake.

We want you to come in person or send a greeting to our conference so that together we can show that the emperors who demand more weapons and do nothing about the climate threat are naked. What we need now is to build trust between people by working together for constructive solutions that make the planet habitable for future generations.

We want you to bring your experiences, your struggles, your organizations and your energy and share them with us. Together we can share sorrow and hope between equal people and demand equal rights for all. Stories that build peaceful coexistence and show ways to create common security and transform military spending into protection,

food and care for all people and our common planet. The devastating experiences of the world wars and fascism created the United Nations and indivisible human, social and civil rights. A beginning was made that has since also become central to cooperation on environmental issues, climate and biodiversity. Issues that are important to all people on earth.

Lack of trust and double standards are now eroding this tool for peaceful relations between nations.. That is why we call for a renewed commitment to peace and the climate and oppose the selective use of rules of conduct between states and people. We call for ways to revive regional and global agreements, including the UN Climate, Peace, Social and Economic Initiatives, the Helsinki Accords, the 1990 Paris Declaration and the Organization for Security and Co-operation in Europe (OSCE). But above all, we want to create grassroots diplomacy across all borders and build trust between movements that support equal rights for all and respect for all living beings and nature.

Therefore, we now call on all people's movements, faith communities and people around the world: Make the celebration of the end of the Second World War and peace a springboard for a new human era where solidarity, humanity and care for all living things take precedence over money and power for a few. Peace and climate justice are necessary to save the future of our children and grand-children!

## **April 25** | Conference – Day 1

9:00 – 10:00 | Morning Session – Getting to Know Each Other and the Region

Welcome speeches

Introduction and networking

Exploring Lithuania and its Eastern neighbors

The first day will focus on case studies addressing peacebuilding—both on Earth and with Earth. We begin by exploring Lithuania and the challenges faced by its people, followed by personal stories from Ukrainian, Belarusian, and Russian refugees now living in the country.

This part of the program may also include interactive information tables, where participants can learn about Lithuanian traditions as well as cultural elements from neighboring Eastern European countries.

To foster cultural exchange, participants from all regions are encouraged to bring a song, a traditional dish, or a story from their homeland to share with others.

10:00 – 11:00 | Group Discussions – Finding Constructive Solutions for Peace on Earth and Peace with EarthParticipants engage in facilitated discussions to share perspectives on key issues related to peacebuilding and environmental sustainability.

Each group selects a rapporteur to summarize their insights.

11:00 – 13:00 | Lunch Break

13:00 – 16:00 | Afternoon Session

Report and Conference Statement

Rapporteurs present the key outcomes from the group discussions.

A draft proposal for a conference statement is introduced.

An editorial team is elected to collect feedback, refine the statement, and develop an action plan.

Key Themes: Building Peace and Protecting Human Rights

This session will explore constructive solutions for conflict resolution and human rights protection, with a focus on:

The Åland and Slesvig/Schleswig models as examples of minority rights protection and sustainable peace.

Current threats to human rights across the region and strategies for solidarity and mutual protection.

Peace with Earth: Environmental Cooperation and Climate Justice

Workshops will address pressing environmental concerns, including:

- The urgency of climate action and climate justice
- Saving the Baltic Sea strategies for restoration and pollution prevention
- Stopping nuclear threats lessons from the successful campaign against Sweden's Barsebäck nuclear reactor near Copenhagen
- Resisting land grabbing the impact of IKEA and Western corporate land acquisitions in Eastern Europe
- Regenerative agriculture sustainable farming solutions for ecological resilience
- Militarization as an environmental threat addressing the impact of military expansion on ecosystems

The session will conclude with a report from the workshops and a summary of key takeaways.


